PRESENTER BIOGRAPHS

Dr John Devlin – Specialist Prosthodontist

A 1978 graduate of the University of Queensland, John spent 10 years in solo private country practice before returning to postgraduate studies at the University of Melbourne. On completing studies and gaining specialist registration John returned to Queensland and established a specialist practice in Prosthodontics on the Sunshine Coast, where he continues to work. Apart from his specialist practice pursuits John has served as visiting consultant at the University of Queensland.

John attended his first implant course almost two decades ago in 1989, a course presented by Gerald Niznick, the founder of Core Vent. Since that time he has gained extensive experience in several implant systems with implantology now accounting for a significant proportion of his clinical day. He maintains membership of the Academy of Australian and New Zealand Prosthodontists and the International College of Prosthodontists.

Dr David Roberts – Specialist Prosthodontist

David completed his undergraduate studies in 1991, graduating with first class honours along with four academic awards from the University of Queensland. On graduating he commenced duty with the Royal Australian Navy as a Dental officer and served at numerous locations in Australia and with the United Nations in Rwanda. David returned to the University of Queensland to undertake a full time Masters course in Prosthodontics, graduating in 1998, and then served his remaining time with the Navy in Canberra and Brisbane.

He is the past President of the Queensland branch of the Australian Prosthodontic Society and past President and Founding Member of the Bennett Movement Dental Study Club. David has lectured extensively on specialist Prosthodontic topics throughout Australia.

Currently, David is a visiting specialist at the University of Queensland, lecturing to both undergraduate and postgraduate students in Prosthodontics – this being additional to his busy private Specialist Prosthodontic practices in Warwick and Brisbane.

Dr Ian Young – Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon

Ian is a dental graduate of the University of Queensland and worked for a short period in private practice before pursuing a keen interest in Rugby while living south of France. His continued dental career included several years in England before entering a Masters program in Oral Surgery at the Eastman Dental Hospital (London). On completing his postgraduate degree and obtaining a Fellowship from The College of Surgeons in Ireland he completed a further 18 months of training at The Queen Victoria Hospital, East Grinstead.

Ian returned to Australia in 1991 to complete 2 years Senior Registrar training in Adelaide only to then undertake a Medical Degree at the University of Adelaide. On obtaining his Medical Degree he returned to Queensland to settle on the Sunshine Coast, complete his medical Internship and subsequently establish his still current Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery specialist practice in Buderim and Kawana Island. More locally, Ian has provided Oral and Maxillofacial services in Gladstone (both privately and publicly) for more than 10 years.

Special interests in his field include Orthognathic Surgery and no less than 20 years experience in placing dental implants – almost since their clinical inception. Ian maintains a keen interest in Cleft Lip and Palate Surgery and has travelled on many occasions to the Philippines and China to participate as a Volunteer Surgeon to less privileged communities.

Dr Greg Peek – Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon

After gaining his undergraduate qualifications from the University of Sydney, Greg joined the Australian Defence Forces serving with both the Royal Australian Navy and Royal Australian Air Force. He undertook his post graduate training at the University of Queensland gaining an MSc in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. Greg holds a fellowship from the RACDS in the specialist field of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.

Since leaving the Australian Defence Force in 1995 Greg has established a busy private practice in Brisbane and continues to hold appointments with a number of public hospitals.
